

Why Doesn't This Train Go To South Station?

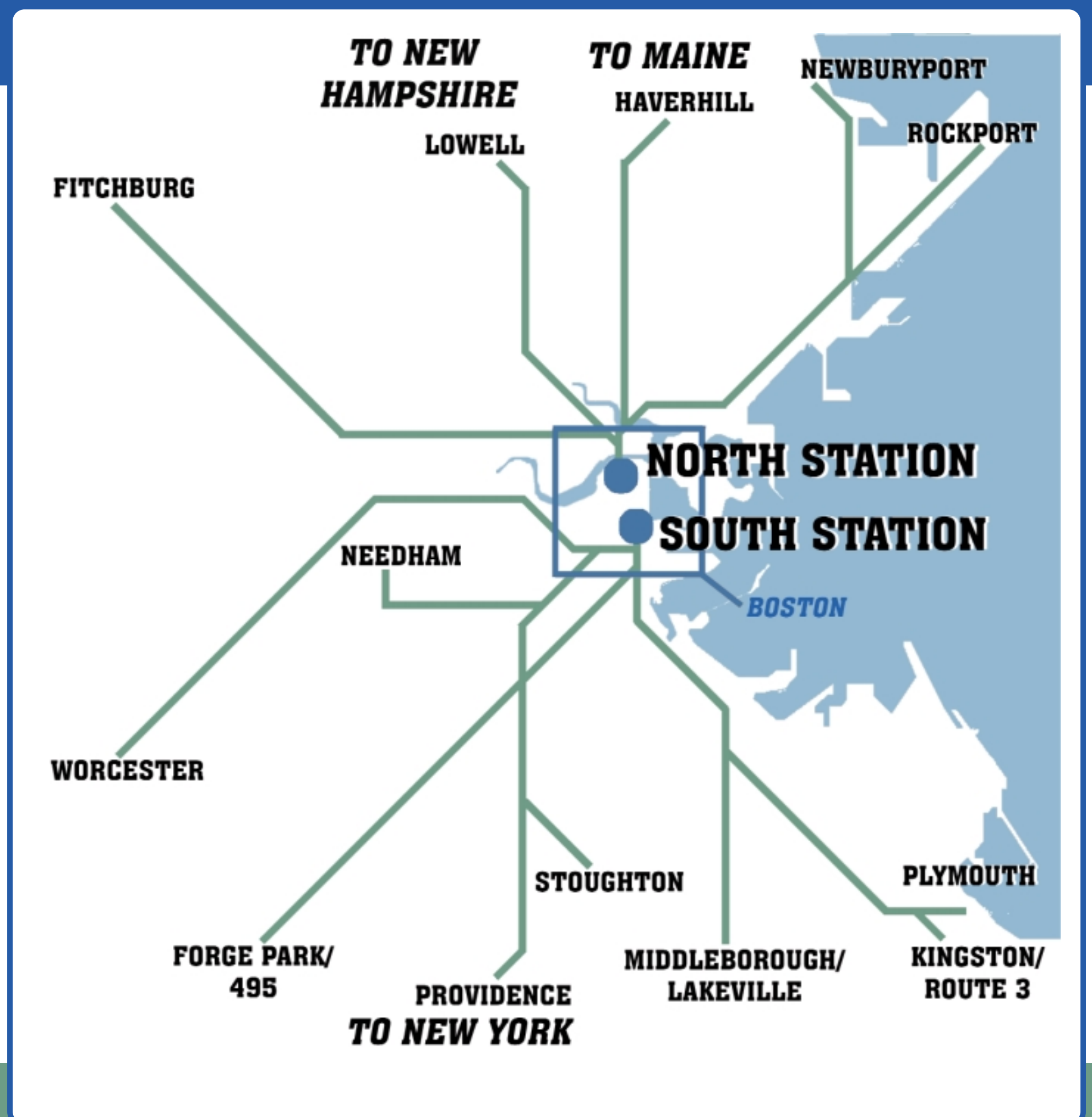
The MBTA says it "would result in the largest absolute travel time savings of any commuter rail project."
